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English Homework: Dragons – Myths and Legends

Read the text carefully at least twice. Choose the reading level that suits you best, or read the whole text!

Introduction

Dragons are famous creatures in stories all over the world. A dragon is a large, mythical reptile. In many Western fairy tales, dragons are dangerous monsters. They can fly, breathe fire, and they often guard a treasure in a dark cave. A brave knight usually tries to fight the dragon to save a princess or a kingdom.

Main Text

Dragons have been part of human mythology for thousands of years. However, dragons are very different depending on where the stories come from.

In European folklore, dragons are often seen as evil and greedy. They have giant wings, sharp claws, and hard scales that protect them like armor. People were afraid of them because they destroyed villages and stole gold.

In Asian cultures, especially in China, dragons are completely different! Chinese dragons are usually seen as wise, friendly, and lucky. They look like long snakes with four legs, and they usually do not have wings. Instead of breathing fire, they are connected to water, rain, and storms. People in China still celebrate dragons today, especially during the Chinese New Year.

Challenge (Extra)

Why did people start believing in dragons in the first place? Historians believe that ancient people might have found dinosaur fossils or giant snake bones without knowing what they were. To explain these massive skeletons, they invented stories about giant, fire-breathing monsters.

Today, dragons are still very popular in modern books, movies, and video games, such as *How to Train Your Dragon*, *Harry Potter*, and *Minecraft*.
